Minutes of the 2024 AGM

[16:20] Nigel GORXA explained that the minutes of the 2024 AGM had been published on the SRS website and circulated by email and as such, would have provided an ample opportunity for members to have had a look at them; the [2024 AGM Minutes](#) were still on the SRS website at the time of the AGM.

Nigel GORXA asked the room if there were any matters arising from last year and then asked the same to the online Webex attendees.

Nigel GORXA confirmed there were no matters arising and asked for a proposer and seconder to approve the 2024 AGM minutes, recorded as follows:

Treasurer's Report

[18:35] Evan presented the Summary of Accounts for the members to have a look at (see Appendix 2) and explained that he would go into further detail during his PowerPoint presentation; he also confirmed that, after resolving a few queries, the accounts had been signed off by the auditor (see Appendix 3).

Evan then summarised the income and expenditure for the financial year 2024/25, the income was £3770; down about 13% from last year which is a bit disappointing; expenses were up quite a bit though; we went from a surplus last year into a deficit, i.e. a £2500 turnaround unfortunately, although this was really due to just one-offs; with regards to the income decrease, last year we sold an Icom IC-7400 for about £400 and we didn't have any sort of asset sales this year; meeting attendance was also down and as commented by Nigel GORXA we didn't have the Saturday breakfasts for a portion of the year either; Evan acknowledged and agreed that this was also part of the reason.

Income and Expenditure

- 2024-25 income £3,770; £4,407 in 2023-24; **down 13%**
- 2024-25 expenses £5,414; £3,627 in 2023-24; **up 49%**
- → £1,645 (expenditure net of income) in 2024-25
 - 2023-24: £779 (*i.e. a surplus*)
 - = £2,424 *turnaround*
- Income decrease due greatly to:
 - Absence of asset sales (£400 in 2023-24)
 - Meeting attendance fees down 14% on 2023-24

Income and Expenditure

- £5,144 of current expenditure in 2024-25 (£2,904 in 2023-24), largely reflecting purchase of:
 - Mast (£1,875)
 - Skills Night kits' material (£275)
 - Issue with fraud on SumUp 'virtual' debit card (i.e. card number)
 - £82.89 balance owed to SRS recorded as expense
 - May get this back in FY 2025-26
 - Card number facility since cancelled



Evan then continued with a brief explanation of current expenditure which was obviously quite a lot higher than it was last year, mostly due to the purchase of a new mast for the contest group which was about £1900 and we bought some skills night materials as well, however, we'll be getting some money back for the latter, so that will pay for itself.

Evan then gave a brief explanation with regards to the fraud issue with the Sum-Up (card/contactless payment machine) account; they (Sum-Up) have a 'virtual (debit) card' linked to the account which Evan himself was unaware of; the virtual card number allows Sum-Up members to make use of this for debit card transactions, mostly on-line purchases; there were some fraudulent transactions relating to this 'virtual' card number and also some money credited to the account as well; ultimately, the balance of this is about £83; still trying to get this back from Sum-Up; however, has been recorded as a sundry loss in these accounts, but there is a slight chance that we may get it back; all just a bit annoying really; confirmed that the card facility has been cancelled so this issue won't happen again.

Continuing with the Asset List (See Appendix 4) Evan explained that the latest purchases were down at the bottom; only 2 purchases this year: 1) second hand 2m/70cms transceiver for £100; and 2) a speaker for the Icom IC-7610 at £170; so, a total of only £270 spent on assets.

Moving on to the Balance Sheet (shown on the following page) Evan explained that the assets were down 7% from last year, mostly due to the spend on the new mast which is a one-off expense and doesn't go towards our capital, a bit of a blow and also we've got the continuing depreciation of the assets that we already hold.

Looking at the proportion of assets held in cash, this has been boosted a little bit to 89% this year coming off 84% last year; again, mainly due to the mast purchase which was not considered as a capital expenditure, so the result is that the cash portion went up.

Concluding his Treasurer's report, Evan asked if there were any matters arising, while Nigel G0RXA asked if there were any questions for the Treasurer.

Tony asked Evan how we were doing for membership renewals; Evan commented that there were about 37 renewals so far; Nigel G0RXA mentioned that this (membership) will be seen more in the next (Secretary's) report and commented that the current membership at the end of November 2025 stands at 88.

A question from the floor queried whether this membership figure was up or down compared to last year; Nigel G0RXA confirmed that for 2024, the membership stood at 83, while the previous year was 88; so, you win some and lose some over the years.

Nigel G0RXA commented what is interesting is that we've had quite a few new members come to us, as those attending may have probably seen on a Saturday, so, although there's been those dropping out, they've more-or-less been replaced by new people joining from various places.

Nigel G0RXA continued, commenting that Nigel M0VNL would probably be wary of this as well and explained, we've had quite a few phone calls and emails from people who were interested in coming along and seeing us, citing a visitor who is coming along on Saturday 13th and bringing a load of radios that he wants to dispose of free-of-charge, but there's a potential that he may come along and possibly join us; this route into SRS is one thing that the Saturdays do for us, they provide opportunities for people to come along, who are not used to us and spend a bit of time and off the back of that hopefully memberships will come; however, this is a different topic to what the Treasurer had been discussing.

Nigel G0RXA then asked if there were any queries from the online Webex attendees as far as the Treasurer is concerned and confirmed that there were none.



Nigel GORXA then explained how SRS uses the RSGB e.g. for promoting the club; there is the Club Diary page for listing regular activities and there is also the Club News page, although recently haven't tended to send them off because it tends to be the same thing repeated each year, however, anything unusual that we do, e.g. Armed Forces Day, then a communication will be sent and they are usually quite good at publishing the article; unfortunately, on the last two occasions they chopped and changed and completely changed stories so, it does make you wonder if it's worthwhile at times; what we send off to the Club Dairy page, i.e. what appears in Radcom, also appears in the GB2RS news broadcast; however, we must bear in mind that there is about a 2-month lead time to publication, so if we're setting up anything in our diary, no matter what it is, we have to be careful that we don't chop and change etc.; and finally, we've got the various social media feeds as well, as far as the RSGB is concerned.



Nigel G0RXA displayed the current schedule for the on-air nets (see above slide) and had a brief discussion with Simon M0TYT with regards to him hosting the 6-metre net next week; Simon confirmed he was able to do so.

Nigel G0RXA discussed the 2-metre SSB where there is a struggle to find net controllers; Keith M0JYP recently covered the November session and will also host December but going into next year we'll be looking for net controllers to take it over; Nigel G0RXA asked if there was anyone willing to do so; Keith M0JYP offered to carry on hosting with the 2-metre SSB net and commented that this is only once a month and not every week; Nigel G0RXA acknowledged and thanked Keith for his support.





Extraordinary General Meeting

- **Purpose of Meeting:** To agree amendment to Paragraph 13e of the 2019 Constitution.
- **Reason for proposal:** To allow, at the outgoing committee's discretion, a nomination for a place on the future committee where the requirement for a consecutive period of membership has not been met.

[10:02] Nigel G0RXA explained that the purpose of this particular meeting is to agree an amendment to Paragraph 13e) of the 2019 Constitution and the reason for the proposal is to allow, at the outgoing committee's discretion, a nomination for a place on the future committee where the requirement for a consecutive period of membership, which states three years in the constitution, has not been met, highlighting the reason why the EGM was being held.

Nigel G0RXA presented the relevant paragraph (see below) as it reads at the moment, with the sentence concerned underlined.

Paragraph 13e currently reads:

- All nominations for Officers and Committee Members shall be Proposed and Seconded and will only be valid if confirmed by the nominee. Any nominee must have been a member of Stockport Radio Society for three consecutive years. The Secretary must be notified of any such nominations at least one meeting prior to the Annual General Meeting. Serving Committee Members will be automatically nominated provided that they wish to continue.

Nigel G0RXA explained that the committee would like to change this sentence with the additional text in red below.

Paragraph 13e including proposed amendment:

- All nominations for Officers and Committee Members shall be Proposed and Seconded and will only be valid if confirmed by the nominee. Any nominee must have been a member of Stockport Radio Society for three consecutive years *or as recommended by the outgoing committee.* The Secretary must be notified of any such nominations at least one meeting prior to the Annual General Meeting. Serving Committee Members will be automatically nominated provided that they wish to continue.

Nigel G0RXA further explained the reason behind this is that should the committee find themselves in a situation where there are nominations for the new committee, but these nominee(s) don't quite fulfil the three consecutive year requirement, then, if the outgoing committee is happy with these nominee(s) the process of committee nominations can just simply carry on.

Nigel G0RXA continued, this is the whole reason behind the modification to the Constitution and highlighted that this would become apparent when we get to the committee nominations stage in the AGM.

Nigel GORXA then asked if anybody in the room had any questions in relation to the proposed modification as described above and the reasons as to why the committee were doing this.

There were no questions from anybody present at Walthew House.

Neil confirmed with Nigel GORXA that this topic was not a debate, just a simple 'yes' or 'no' to the proposal as described by the committee.

Nigel GORXA then reiterated the purpose of the EGM and the proposed modification to the Constitution and asked if there were any questions from those attending online via Webex.

There were no questions from anybody attending online via Webex.

Nigel GORXA then asked for all those at Walthew House who were in favour of the proposal to raise their hands and following this, for all those online via Webex who were in favour to acknowledge by raising a hand or motioning via their webcam.

Nigel GORXA asked if anybody was against the proposal.

Nigel GORXA confirmed that this was a unanimous decision with a total of 22 votes 'for' the proposal.

- For the purpose of the minutes, all 18 attendees at Walthew House and the 4 attendees who were online via Webex at the time of the vote, all voted in favour of the proposal. There were no votes against.
- For reference, the two online attendees Simon MOTYY and Gordon MOLAR joined via Webex after the EGM had finished and so have not been included in this tally.

Nigel GORXA concluded by summarising the reason behind the need for the EGM and confirmed that the new paragraph has been passed and that everyone was happy with the result.

Stephen, as an outgoing committee member, expressed his agreement that the people (nominees) that are now eligible for election can now stand. Nigel GORXA acknowledged and explained that this would come later as far as the AGM is concerned because all nominees are listed anyway.

Audit of Stockport Radio Society (SRS) 2024-25 Accounts

Dear Evan,

I have completed the audit of the accounts for the financial year November 2024 to October 2025.

Checks have been undertaken on the income and expenditure detailed within the bank statements (Barclays account ending in 6314 and the Vernon Building Society account), together with invoices, receipts, inventory, and other supporting documents provided by the Treasurer. I have also considered the Treasurer's notes provided in relation to transactions.

During the course of the audit, I raised several queries which have now been addressed in your responses and reflected in the revised accounts 2025 spreadsheet where relevant:

- **Transaction 74** – confirmed as membership subscriptions.
- **Transaction 97** – confirmed this is correctly categorised under meeting attendance monies, as this related to food provided at the meeting.
- **Transaction 171** – queried whether this needs to be reclassified from membership subscriptions to donations. This amount was included correctly within the donations figure (£316.40) on the income worksheet, so no adjustment was required.
- **Transaction 187** – reclassified from meeting attendance monies to sundry expenses. The revised spreadsheet reflects this change, with the -£10.06 amount moved accordingly.

I have also noted the unauthorised credits and debits issue within sumup and these have been treated as sundry income and sundry expenses respectively, effectively recognising the loss. The committee has accepted this approach, and while recovery attempts continue, the outstanding balance (£82.89) will be recorded as sundry income should it be recovered in financial year 2025–26.

I am satisfied that the accounts present a true and fair record of the financial position for the year ended October 2025, with only minor points which required clarification.



Harry Arnfield G3LX Trustees (HA Trustees) Report 2024-2025

Report for SRS AGM from trustees of HA Account November 12th 2025

No physical meeting took place, but with the agreement of the trustees, by email, a short brief would suffice.
